# INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CAR BOOSTER SEAT



1. Remove the contents of the box.

2. Locate all parts of the booster seat:

- <sup>1</sup> SHERPA-LINED BUCKET SEAT
- <sup>2</sup> FRONT OVERHEAD STRAP
- <sup>3</sup> BACK OVERHEAD STRAP
- <sup>4</sup> SAFETY LEASH
- <sup>5</sup> REAR STRAP



3. Clear the car seat surface of any clutter.

4. Beginning with the <sup>5</sup>rear strap, unbuckle and adjust to fit the width AROUND the back of the car seat. Place the booster seat flat on the car seat in the open, upright position. Re-buckle the <sup>5</sup>rear strap and tighten to ensure the booster seat will not move or slide.



5. Next, unbuckle the <sup>3</sup>back overhead strap and adjust to fit AROUND the car seat head rest. This should raise the car seat protector (flap of fabric that is connected to the <sup>3</sup>back overhead strap) to the upright position. Re-buckle the <sup>3</sup>back overhead strap and tighten to ensure the booster seat remains upright. Please be aware: the booster seat may not completely touch the car seat surface, a small gap between the booster seat and car seat is intended.



6. Repeat step 5, this time with the <sup>2</sup>front overhead strap. This strap, attaching at the front of the booster seat to around the car seat head rest, should solidify the booster seat in its place. Please be aware: the booster seat may not completely touch the car seat surface, a small gap between the booster seat and car seat is intended.



7. Once you have made sure the booster seat is secure, it will be ready for your dog to sit in it. Place your dog, with a harness on, in the <sup>1</sup>bucket seat. Attach the <sup>4</sup>safety leash located inside the booster seat to your dog's harness, and adjust the strap to your dog's size. Your dog should not be able to exit the <sup>1</sup>bucket seat.

**\*Note: DO NOT attach the <sup>4</sup>safety leash to anything other than a correctly worn harness, ESPECIALLY your dog's collar. This could cause serious injuries to your dog upon sudden stops or accidents.\***
